Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Application)

Developing Reorder words in a sentence stem and complete the sentence. Words included do not feature split digraphs and vocabulary choices are single consonant, vowel sounds or digraphs. The conjunction 'and' is featured in sentences.

Expected Reorder words in a sentence stem and complete the sentence. Using phonetically decodable words, including all phonic sounds. The conjunctions 'and', 'but' and 'so' are featured in sentences.

Greater Depth Reorder words in a sentence stem and complete the sentence. Using some words that cannot be phonetically decoded. The conjunctions 'and', 'but' and 'so' are featured in sentences.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain whether the order of words in a given sentence is correct. Words included do not feature split digraphs and vocabulary choices are single consonant, vowel sounds or digraphs.

Expected Explain whether the order of words in a given sentence is correct. Using phonetically decodable words, including all phonic sounds.

Greater Depth Explain whether the order of words in a given sentence is correct. Using some words that cannot be phonetically decoded.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application)

Developing Rewrite a sentence, omitting unnecessary words. The conjunction 'and' is featured in sentences.

Expected Rewrite a question, omitting unnecessary words. The conjunctions 'and', 'but' and 'so' are featured in sentences.

Greater Depth Rewrite a question, omitting unnecessary words. The conjunctions 'and', 'but' and 'so' are featured in sentences and some words are not phonetically decodable.

Greater Depth

- 7a. Various answers, for example: Our house is small but it is full of people.
- 8a. No, it should be 'Our school is big, but it is still friendly.'
- 9a. Can you sing songs and do a dance at the same time?

Greater Depth

- 7b. Various answers, for example: I like pears best so I have one every day.
- 8b. No, it should be 'I went on the slide and the climbing frame at the playground.'
- 9b. Do you know where my shirt is so I can put it on?
