### English

The children will be retelling their own story of 'We're Going on a Lion Hunt', they will also be researching and writing facts about African animals.

#### How You Can Help

Please read with your child every day and talk to them about what they are reading. Ask them questions about the story, characters and plot. Can they predict what will happen next?

Read information texts.

When the children are writing they need to be thinking about their punctuation; using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.

Please encourage your child to form their letters correctly.

### Maths

In Maths this term we will develop our mathematical skills by focusing on recognising the value of money, finding missing numbers by using addition and subtraction methods, multiplication and division.

#### How You Can Help

Practise writing numbers in words. Learning addition and subtraction facts to twenty. Please help your child to become familiar with money by discussing different coins and their values. Give them opportunity to add coins together and work out the correct change.



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### PE

Seahorses will have PE on a Wednesday morning. Please ensure your child comes to school with the correct, named PE kit and that it is in school every day.

Please ensure that if children are bringing money in to school, that it is in a named envelope, so that we can keep it safe.
