English

In English we will be reading Anansi and the Pot of Beans. Later in the term we will be learning about famous Jamaican people.

How You Can Help

- Please read with your child every day and talk to them about what they are reading. Ask them questions about the story, characters and plot. Can they predict what will happen next?
- Read information texts.
- When the children are writing they need to be thinking about their punctuation; using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.
- Please encourage your child to form their letters correctly.

Maths

In Maths this term we will develop our calculation skills by focusing on the four operations; addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

How You Can Help

Practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's from any given number. Learning addition and subtraction facts to twenty. Please ensure that you are practising number bonds to 10 and 20 with your child, as this will help them with quick calculations. Also please help your child to become familiar with money by discussing different coins and their values. Give them opportunities to add coins together and work out change.



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PE

Seahorses will have PE on Monday afternoons.

Please ensure your child comes to school with the correct, named PE kit and that it is in school every day.

Please ensure that if children are bringing money in to school, that it is in a named envelope, so that we can keep it safe.
